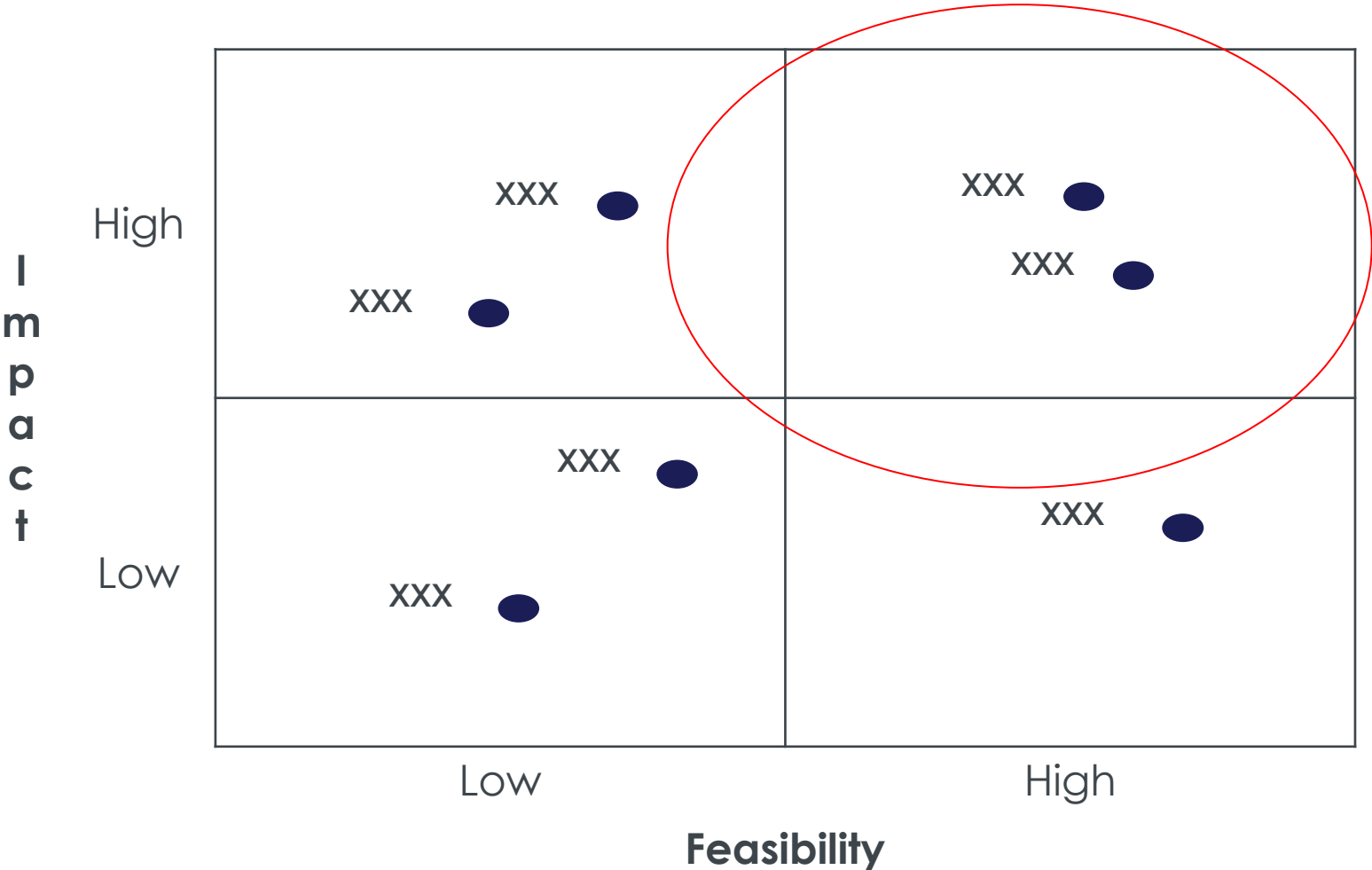

How to use the prioritisation matrix

What is this tool?

A simple two-factor prioritisation matrix can be very effective in prioritising the issues your project will address. It focuses your time on the questions that are most impactful ensure you use your time and resources most efficiently

Tips for prioritising your project ideas

- Develop a set of prioritisation criteria that are most appropriate to your project and decision (e.g., impact vs. timing, or impact vs. level of control)
- Take each project idea generated and place it on the matrix:
- The vertical axis measures how much **impact** the project idea will have on the overall problem to be solved. If the impact is small, then there is no point in devoting effort to it
- The horizontal axis measures the **feasibility of implementing** the idea – including the level of resource needed and the level of control / ability the team has to make changes happen
